General safety guidelines

Always observe the following precautions to reduce the risk of injury and property damage.

Service

Do not attempt to service a product yourself unless instructed to do so by the Customer Support Center. Use only a service provider who is approved to repair your particular product.

Note: Some parts can be upgraded or replaced by the customer. These parts are referred to as Customer Replaceable Units, or CRUs. Lenovo expressly identifies CRUs as such, and provides documentation with instructions when it is appropriate for customers to replace those parts. You must closely follow all instructions when performing such replacements. Always make sure that the power is turned off and that the product is unplugged from any power source before you attempt the replacement. If you have any questions or concerns, contact the Customer Support Center.

Power cords and power adapters

Use only the power cords and power adapters supplied by the product manufacturer.

Never wrap a power cord around the power adapter or other object. Doing so can stress the cord in ways that can cause the cord to fray, crack or crimp. This can present a safety hazard.

Always route power cords so that they will not be walked on, tripped over, or pinched by objects.

Protect the cord and power adapters from liquids. For instance, do not leave your cord or power adapter near sinks, tubs, toilets, or on floors that are cleaned with liquid cleansers. Liquids can cause a short circuit, particularly if the cord or power adapter has been stressed by misuse. Liquids can also cause gradual corrosion of the power cord terminals and/or the connector terminals on the adapter which can eventually result in overheating.

Always connect power cords and signal cables in the correct order and ensure that all power cord connectors are securely and completely plugged into receptacles.

Do not use any power adapter that shows corrosion at the ac input pins and/or shows signs of overheating (such as deformed plastic) at the ac input or anywhere on the power adapter.

Do not use any power cords where the electrical contacts on either end show signs of corrosion or overheating or where the power cord appears to have been damaged in any way.

Extension cords and related devices

Ensure that extension cords, surge protectors, uninterruptible power supplies, and power strips that you use are rated to handle the electrical requirements of the product. Never overload these devices. If power strips are used, the load should not exceed the power strip input rating. Consult an electrician for more information if you have questions about power loads, power requirements, and input ratings.

Plugs and outlets

If a receptacle (power outlet) that you intend to use with your computer equipment appears to be damaged or corroded, do not use the outlet until it is replaced by a qualified electrician.

Do not bend or modify the plug. If the plug is damaged, contact the manufacturer to obtain a replacement.

Some products are equipped with a three-pronged plug. This plug fits only into a grounded electrical outlet. This is a safety feature. Do not defeat this safety feature by trying to insert it into a non-grounded outlet. If you cannot insert the plug into the outlet, contact an electrician for an approved outlet adapter or to replace the outlet with one that enables this safety feature. Never overload an electrical outlet. The overall system load should not exceed 80 percent of the branch circuit rating. Consult an electrician for more information if you have questions about power loads and branch circuit ratings.

Be sure that the power outlet you are using is properly wired, easily accessible, and located close to the equipment. Do not fully extend power cords in a way that will stress the cords.

Connect and disconnect the equipment from the electrical outlet carefully

Batteries

All personal computers manufactured by Lenovo contain a non-rechargeable coin cell battery to provide power to the system clock. In addition many mobile products such as ThinkPad notebook PCs utilize a rechargeable battery pack to provide system power when in portable mode. Batteries supplied by Lenovo for use with your product have been tested for compatibility and should only be replaced with Lenovo approved parts.

Never attempt to open or service any battery. Do not crush, puncture, or incinerate batteries or short circuit the metal contacts. Do not expose the battery to water or other liquids. Only recharge the battery pack strictly according to instructions included in the product documentation.

Battery abuse or mishandling can cause the battery to overheat, which can cause gasses or flame to "vent" from the battery pack or coin cell. If your battery is damaged, or if you notice any discharge from your battery or the buildup of foreign materials on the battery leads, stop using the battery and obtain a replacement from the battery manufacturer.

Batteries can degrade when they are left unused for long periods of time. For some rechargeable batteries (particularly Lithium Ion batteries), leaving a battery unused in a discharged state could increase the risk of a battery short circuit, which could

shorten the life of the battery and can also pose a safety hazard. Do not let rechargeable Lithium-Ion batteries completely discharge or store these batteries in a discharged state.

Heat and product ventilation

Computers generate heat when turned on and when batteries are charging. Notebook PCs can generate a significant amount of heat due to their compact size. Always follow these basic precautions:

- Do not leave the base of your computer in contact with your lap or any part of your body for an extended period when the computer is functioning or when the battery is charging. Your computer produces some heat during normal operation. Extended contact with the body could cause discomfort or, potentially, a skin burn.
- Do not operate your computer or charge the battery near flammable materials or in explosive environments.
- Ventilation slots, fans and/or heat sinks are provided with the product for safety, comfort, and reliable operation. These features might inadvertently become blocked by placing the product on a bed, sofa, carpet, or other flexible surface. Never block, cover or disable these features.

CD and DVD drive safety

CD and DVD drives spin discs at a high speed. If a CD or DVD is cracked or otherwise physically damaged, it is possible for the disc to break apart or even shatter when the CD drive is in use. To protect against possible injury due to this situation, and to reduce the risk of damage to your machine, do the following:

- · Always store CD/DVD discs in their original packaging
- Always store CD/DVD discs out of direct sunlight and away from direct heat sources
- Remove CD/DVD discs from the computer when not in use
- Do not bend or flex CD/DVD discs, or force them into the computer or their packaging
- · Check CD/DVD discs for cracks before each use. Do not use cracked or damaged discs




Figure 1-1. Standard Accessories



Important:

- Be sure to attach the lens cap and place the projector into the soft case with the lens facing upward to avoid damaging the lens.



Front angle of projector




Back angle of projector






Chapter 2. Setting up the projector

This chapter provides information on positioning the projector, connecting a computer source and displaying and adjusting an image.

Starting the projector

To start the projector, do the following.


 Connect the power cord to the projector as shown below. Connect the other end of the cord to an electrical outlet. The Power and Lamp-ready LEDs turn on.



- 2. Remove the lens cover.
- 3. Attach any wired input devices.
- 4. Turn on the connected input devices. For more information, go to "Connecting devices" on page 4-1
- 5. Be sure that the Power LED lights steady (not flashing) amber and then press the **Power** button to turn on the projector.

The projector display window opens and the projector detects connected devices. If you are connecting wirelessly, go to Chapter 3.

If you connected the projector to a ThinkPad® computer, press Fn+F7 on the computer to switch the display output to the projector. If you connected the projector to a non-ThinkPad computer, refer to the documentation that came with your computer for information on how to change the display output.



Attention: Do not look directly into the projection lens when the lamp is turned on. The bright light might harm your eyes.

- 6. If you have connected more than one input device to the projector, toggle the Source button to change devices. (DVD and HDTV are supported through the DVI-I cable connector.)
- 7. For information on turning off the projector, go to "Turning off the projector."

Attention: Before moving the projector, be sure to power down the projector properly and disconnect the projector from the main power source. See "Turning off the projector" for more information on turning off the projector normally.

Turning off the projector

To turn off the projector, do the following.

1. Press the **Power** button.

The projector prepares for shut-down and the Wait a moment message displays, as shown below. The projector turns off automatically within 5 seconds.



Note: This operation can be cancelled by pressing a button other than the Power button.

2. Press the **Power** button when the Power Off?/Press Power again message displays, as shown below.

Note: Leave the power cable plugged in for at least 2-5 minutes until the projector returns to room temperature before placing the projector inside the soft case. Placing the projector into the case too soon after switching off the power could cause the projector to overheat.



The projector turns off.

Positioning the projector

To determine where to position the projector, consider the size and shape of your screen, the location of your power outlets, and the distance between the projector and the rest of your equipment. Following are some general guidelines:

- Position the projector on a flat surface at a right angle to the screen. The projector must be at least 1.5 m (4.9 ft) from the projection screen.
- Position the projector within 2.7 m (9 ft) of your power source and within 1.8 m (6 ft) of any wired video devices (unless you purchase extension cables). To ensure adequate cable access, do not place the projector within .15 m (6 in.) of a wall or other object.

Note: Wireless range may vary depending on environmental conditions.

• Position the projector the desired distance from the screen. The distance from the lens of the projector to the screen, the zoom setting, and the video format determine the size of the projected image.

Attention: Ensure that projector air flow is sufficient and not blocked or using recirculated air. Please also ensure that the projector is not in a confined space.





Adjusting the projector level and height

To adjust the projector level and height, complete the following procedure:

- To raise the height of the projector, lift the projector 1 and press the height-adjuster buttons 2. The elevator foot 3 drops down.
- 2. To make minor adjustments to the height, rotate the elevator foot.
- **3**. To lower the level of the projector, press the height-adjuster button and press down on the top of the projector.




Note:

- The projector table or stand should be level and sturdy.
- Position the projector so that it is perpendicular to the screen.
- Be sure the cables are *not* in a place where they can knock over the projector.

Adjusting the image

To adjust the zoom, focus, and keystone for the image, do the following:

1. Twist the rings on the projector to adjust the focus 1 and zoom 2, as shown below.



2. Use the **Keystone** buttons on the projector or the remote to correct image-trapezoid (wider top or bottom) effect.

The keystone control appears on the On Screen Display (OSD), as shown.



Adjusting the volume

To adjust the volume, do the following:

1. Press the **Volume** +/- buttons on the projector or the remote control. The volume control appears on the OSD.



- 2. Use the Volume +/- buttons shown below to adjust the level.
- 3. Press the Mute button (on the remote control only) to turn off the volume.



4. Press any Volume +/- buttons on the projector or remote control to turn off mute.

Chapter 3. Using the wireless features

This chapter provides information on using the wireless features of the C400 Wireless Projector.

Installation

Follow the instructions below to install the Lenovo Wireless Projecting Software.

Note: If there is a previous version of Lenovo Wireless Projecting Software, it is recommended to first uninstall it, then restart the computer prior to installing the new version.

To install the software from the CD or view the User's guide:

- 1. Insert the C400 Wireless Projector Software & User's Guide CD into the CD or DVD drive. If the CD starts automatically, go to Step 5.
- 2. If the CD does not start, click Start and then click Run.
- 3. Type e:\launch.bat where e is the drive letter of the CD or DVD drive.
- 4. Click **OK**. The CD browser window opens.
- 5. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Using the projector software

Lenovo Wireless Projecting Software includes many features such as:

- Starting a wireless projecting session
- · Searching for a wireless projector
- · Binding a wireless projector
- Retrieving the property details of a wireless projector
- Quick projection
- · Selecting a WLAN adapter
- · Remote control emulation
- USB image display
- · Ending a wireless projecting session

Starting a wireless projecting session

To start a wireless projecting session, please follow the steps below:

- 1. Turn on the wireless projector.
- 2. Start the Wireless Projecting Software either through the Start menu or through the desktop icon.

Note: ThinkPad users can press Fn+F7 and use the pre-set scheme; **Presentation on Lenovo Wireless Projector.**

3. The Wireless Projecting Software will then search for wireless projectors and available projectors will be listed. Clicking **Refresh** will refresh the list. For a WEP-enabled wireless projector, there will be a lock mark on the top left corner of the projector icon.

Note: If no WLAN adapter is found, the system will give a warning message, and the task tray icon will dim.

- 4. From the list of projectors found, double-click the projector's ID.
- 5. If the projector is WEP-enabled, enter the correct session key from the projector screen. A correct session key is required in order to start a wireless projecting session.

After a successful wireless projecting session, the session key will be remembered until you exit the wireless projecting software.

When a computer tries to start a wireless projecting session to a projector already displaying an image from a wired device, the following prompt will appear:

By clicking **OK** from a wired device, a wireless projection will begin in the background. The wired projection continues without any interference. You can switch to the wireless projection by pressing the **Wireless** button on the remote, and press **Source** to switch back.

During wireless projection, the disconnection prevention mechanism will reduce unexpected disconnections.

Binding and Unbinding a Projector

Binding is an optional setting which allows a user to select one wireless projector and associate it with the user's notebook. If binding is selected, a hotkey combination (Ctrl + F5) can be used to toggle projecting on/off. Also, when binding is selected, the software automatically projects to the selected wireless projector.

To bind a projector, launch the Lenovo Wireless Projector software application, which will automatically search for available wireless projectors.

A list of available projector(s) will appear. Right-click over the projector in the list that you wish to bind and select the **Bind** option from the pop-up menu (as shown below).



To indicate that binding is on, the projector icon in the list of wireless projectors displays a blue double arrow.

Once binding is selected with one wireless projector, the user can simply toggle projection on/off with the hotkey combination Ctrl+F5 or by selecting **Project** and **End Project** from the system tray icon.

To unbind the projector, start the wireless projector software and right-click over the bound projector in the list (indicated by the blue double arrow). De-select **Bind**. Alternately, the user can right-click the software icon in the system tray and select **Configuration**. Choose the **Setting** tab and uncheck the **Projector Binding** check box. Select **OK** to confirm and close the window.

Retrieving the property of a projector

After starting the Wireless Projecting Software, right-click the **projector** found in the Current Projectors List displayed in the system tray, to display the popup menu. Then select **Property** to show the projector ID, model, version, and status.



Status of the projector

There are five working statuses of the projector:

- Ready
- · Wireless projecting
- · Wired projecting
- USB image display
- Unknown


Note: Projector property cannot be retrieved during wireless projecting.

Wireless software configuration

Right-click the Lenovo Wireless Projector system tray icon on the bottom right of the screen. Select Configuration to open the Configuration window.

Selecting adapter

In the Adapter tab the current WLAN adapter will be shown.



If there is more than one WLAN adapter in your notebook computer, you can perform wireless projection while browsing the Internet. You can select one of the WLAN adapters to project by clicking the drop-down list box, as shown below:

Note: Anytime you move the mouse pointer over the Lenovo Wireless Projector system tray icon, the information for the selected WLAN adapter will appear.

In the **Setting** tab, the current binding setting will be shown.



When **Projector binding** is checked, the projector binding function is enabled.

The ID of the bound projector will appear in the box below **Projector binding**, as shown above.

After unchecking **Projector binding**, Bind Projector in the right-click menu will be gray, and you cannot bind any projector.


To prevent the quick projecting confirmation window from appearing, check **Don't show the quick projecting dialog**, in the **Setting** tab.

If you want to disable the binding projector function or quick projection function, please uncheck the Projector binding, then click **OK**.

Remote controller emulation

Remote controller emulation has the same functions as a remote controller. For example, you can use the remote emulation controller to open the projector menu, configure the projector, and turn off the projector with it.

The Remote controller emulation item can only be shown on the system tray menu on the bottom right corner of the desktop, when the projector is in wireless projecting status. Right-click the **Lenovo Wireless Projector** system tray icon, and select **Emulation remote controller** to open the controller panel, as shown below.



Buttons of the remote emulation controller



Listed below are the remote emulation controller buttons and functions:


• Menu: Open the projector OSD menu or go back to the previous menu level.

Note: The OSD menu will only display on the projector screen. For more information go to "Navigating the OSD" on page 7-1.

- Back: Back to previous menu level.
- Close: Click this button and there will be a confirmation message. Click **Yes** to turn the projector off.
- Up, Down, Left and Right: Operates the same as remote-control keys.
- Enter: Confirm changes.
- Close: Close the remote emulation controller.

USB image display

The projector has a built-in USB port, which can play pictures from a USB memory key. The USB image display option will only be shown on the Lenovo Wireless Projector tray menu on the bottom right corner of the desktop, while the projector is in a wireless projecting state, as shown below.



Right-click the Lenovo Wireless Projector icon in the system tray and select USB image display to start this function.

Note: You may also start USB image display with the projector OSD menu. For information go to "USB image display" on page 3-7 on page 5-3.

Ending projection

You can use any of the following procedures to end the current wireless projection session:

- Right-click Lenovo Wireless Projector system tray icon to select End Project.
- Press hotkeys (Ctrl+F5) to end the current projection.
- · Double-click the Lenovo Wireless Projector system tray icon, and the following prompt will appear:
 - Select **Yes** to end the projection, and **No** to abort this action.
- Press Wireless button on the remote controller to end the projection immediately.
- Right-click Lenovo Wireless Projector system tray icon to select Exit.

Note: This procedure will also end your software session.

After ending the projection, your original network environment will be restored, and other notebook computers can project to the projector.

Wireless projector system tray icon

After starting the Wireless Projecting software, you can right-click the Wireless Projector system tray icon.

- **Project**: Select **Project**, or press the hotkey **P** for the quick projection to the bound projector. If there is no projector to be bound in the wireless projector list, the main window will be shown.
- Configuration: Select Configuration, Setting tab and the Adapters tab can be selected in Configuration dialog.
- About: Select About, you can view the version information of the Lenovo Wireless Projector Service Application.

• Exit: Select Exit to stop Lenovo Wireless Projector program.

After starting the wireless projection, you can right-click **Wireless Projector** system tray icon on the bottom right of the screen, then the follow tray menu will appear:

- End Project: Select End Project, or press the hotkeys (Ctrl+F5) to end the current wireless projection.
- Emulation remote controller: Select Emulation remote controller to open the software remote controller on your computer.
- **USB image display**: Select **USB image display** to start projecting images stored on a USB memory key.
- **About**: Select **About**, you can view the version information of the Lenovo Wireless Projector Service Application.
- Exit: Select Exit to stop Lenovo Wireless Projector program.

Exit

Right-click **Lenovo Wireless Projector** system tray icon to select **Exit** to stop Lenovo Wireless Projector program.

Note: When a ThinkPad user presses Fn+F7 and selects a different display scheme in Presentation Director, this will also stop the Lenovo Wireless Projection Program. You will lose all saved session keys anytime you stop the Lenovo Wireless Projection Software, (even when it is in wireless projection.)

Note: Lenovo Wireless Projecting Software can exit any time even when it is in wireless projection, then, all saved session keys will be lost.

Uninstallation

Please see the steps below to remove uninstall the Wireless Projecting Software:

- 1. Click Start.
- 2. Click Programs.
- 3. Click Lenovo Wireless Projector.
- 4. Click Uninstall Lenovo Wireless Projector.
- 5. Follow the onscreen instructions.





Remote mouse control using USB

Note: For wireless projecting sessions, USB connection is not required.

To control your computer mouse using the projector remote control, connect the projector to the computer with a USB cable as shown below:



Note: USB mouse function is only supported with $Microsoft^{\tiny{(8)}}\mbox{Windows}^{\tiny{(9)}}\mbox{2000}$ and Windows XP.

Connecting to a computer monitor

If you want to see the image on a separate monitor as well as on the projection screen, plug the monitor cable to the monitor out connector on the projector.

Chapter 5. Maintenance

This chapter provides information on projector maintenance.

Cleaning the projector

Cleaning the projector to remove dust and grime will help ensure trouble-free operation.

- Be sure to turn off and unplug the projector at least 1 hour before cleaning. Failure to do so could result in a severe burn.
- Use only a dampened cloth when cleaning. Do not allow water to enter the ventilation openings on the projector.
- If a little water gets into the projector interior while cleaning, leave it unplugged in a well-ventilated room for several hours before using.
- If a lot of water gets into the projector interior when cleaning, have the projector serviced.

Cleaning the lens

To clean the lens, complete the following procedure:

1. Apply a non-abrasive camera lens cleaner to a soft, dry cloth.

Note: Avoid using an excessive amount of cleaner, and do not apply the cleaner directly to the lens. Abrasive cleaners, solvents or other harsh chemicals might scratch the lens.

2. Lightly wipe the cleaning cloth over the lens in a circular motion. If you do not intend to use the projector immediately, replace the lens cap.

Cleaning the case

Follow the steps below to clean the projector case:

- 1. Wipe off dust with a clean dampened cloth.
- 2. Moisten the cloth with warm water and mild detergent (such as dish detergent), and wipe the case.
- 3. Rinse all detergent from the cloth and wipe the case again.


Note: To prevent discoloration or fading of the case, do not use abrasive alcohol-based cleaners.

Replacing the projector lamp


The projector lamp should only be replaced with an Lenovo certified replacement part, which you can order from your business partner or go to www.lenovo.com/think.

To replace the projector lamp, complete the following procedure:

- 1. Turn off the projector, unplug the power cord, and allow the projector to cool for at least 1 hour.
- 2. Use a Phillips-head screwdriver to remove the screw from the lamp compartment cover as shown in 1.
- 3. Remove the lamp compartment cover as shown in 2.




- 4. Remove the two screws from the lamp module as shown in 3.
- 5. Lift the module handle up and pull up firmly as shown in 4.



6. Reverse steps 1 through 5 to install the new lamp module.

Note: The lamp module should be oriented as shown below when replacing.

Resetting the lamp timer


After replacing the lamp, you should reset the lamp hour counter to zero. Please follow the steps below.

- 1. Press the **Menu** button to open the main menu.
- 2. Press the cursor left/right button to move to the Info menu.
- 3. Press the cursor **up/down** button to move down to Lamp Timer.
- 4. Press the Enter button. The screen will show Press Enter to Lamp Timer Reset.
- 5. Press the Enter button again to reset the lamp hours.

Attention: Lamp Life is a measure of brightness degradation only and is not a specification for the time it takes a lamp to fail and cease light output. Lamp Life is defined as the time it takes for more than 50% of a lamp sample population to have brightness decrease by approximately 50% of the rated lumens for the specified lamp. For example, if the defined life of a sample set of lamps is 2000 hours and their brightness is rated at 1100 lumens, then after 2000 hours 50% of the lamps will still be brighter than 550 lumens.

Using the security slot

The projector has a security slot, as shown. Refer to the information that comes with the lock for instructions on how to use it.


This chapter provides information on installing the remote control batteries and using the remote control, audio, keypad buttons, and other projector features.

Before you begin

Before you can use the remote control, you must install the AAA batteries that come with this projector. To install the batteries, do the following:

Note:

- Use only AAA alkaline batteries.
- Dispose of used batteries according to local government ordinance regulations.
- Remove the batteries when not using the remote control for prolonged periods.
- 1. Remove the battery compartment cover from the remote control as shown.
- 2. Insert the supplied batteries into the remote control battery compartment, aligning the polarity (+/-) of the batteries with the polarity icons in the compartment, as shown.
- 3. Replace the cover, as shown.





Operating range

This remote control uses infrared transmission to control the projector. It is not necessary to point the remote directly at the projector. The remote control will function within a maximum radius of 10m (32.8 ft) and 30° above or below the projector level. If the projector does not respond to the remote control, please see Appendix A, "Troubleshooting," on page A-1.

Note: The remote will still work when it is pointed at the projected image.

Projector and remote control buttons

The projector can be operated using the remote control or the buttons on the top of the projector. All operations can be carried out with the remote control.

USB image display

USB image display can display pictures from a USB memory device. It includes the following functions: scaling, auto-play and displaying in full screen.

USB image display can support five image formats (JPG, BMP, GIF except the animate feature of GIF89a PCX and PNG) and one image index file format (.IDX).

USB image display supports English and Simplified Chinese. When Simplified Chinese is selected in the OSD menu, both English and Simplified Chinese file names will be shown. When a language other than Simplified Chinese is selected in the OSD menu, the interface will be in English and file names in western languages such as English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, etc. can be shown.

Operation description

There are two ways of starting the USB image display:

- When the projector is in wireless projecting status, right click **Lenovo Wireless Projector** system tray icon, and select **USB image display** in the tray menu.
- Press menu button on the control panel of the projector or remote controller, then select Information >Wireless Setting>USB Image Display in the OSD menu.

In the USB image display status, you can browse pictures using the remote control left mouse button, right mouse button, cursor pad, PgUp and PgDn keys on the remote controller.

Menu selections

After you start the USB image display, the menu selections will appear in the toolbar. They are: Open, Auto Slide Show/Manual Slide Show, Previous , Next , Optimal Size/Original Size, Full Screen Mode and Exit.

Open

When clicking **Open** with the remote control, a window will open displaying all files that can be displayed in USB memory device and directories.

Select the file to be displayed from the list, and then click **Confirm** to start displaying.

Note: If the selected file is an index file (a plain text file with an .idx extension), the first file listed will be played after clicking Confirm; otherwise, the selected file will be played.

Previous

This opens the previous image stored in the same directory until the first image is displayed.

Next

This opens the next image stored in the same directory until the last image is displayed.

In full screen mode, when the last picture is shown, pressing PgDn key will go back to the first picture.

Auto Slide Show/Manual Slide Show

Selecting the Auto Slide Show/Manual Slide Show function, switches the image display between Manual Slide Show and Auto Slide Show. The default is Manual Slide Show.

In Manual Slide Show mode, the user can step through images using Previous and Next images.

In Auto Slide Show status, the images will change automatically every three seconds. After the last image has finished being displayed, it will go back to the first image.

Optimal Size/Original Size

If you click Optimal Size or double click left button (non full screen mode), images will be shown in optimal size (filling the screen). Click Original Size or double-click left button (non full screen mode), so the image will be shown in its original size.

Full Screen Mode

After opening a file, you can select Full Screen Mode or click the right button to switch back to full screen mode. Click right button to switch to non-full screen mode.

Exit

Exit stops the USB image display mode. To re-establish projection, select from the Lenovo Wireless Projector system tray icon, and choose project.

Chapter 7. On-Screen Display menu controls

This projector has an On-Screen Display (OSD) that lets you make image adjustments and change various settings.

Note: You must have a display on the screen in order to access some functions of the OSD.

Navigating the OSD

You can use the remote control or the buttons on the top of the projector to navigate and make changes to the OSD. The following sections show the menus in the OSD.

Language

To set the OSD language, do the following:

Note: The default OSD language is English.

- 1. Press the Menu button.
- 2. Press the cursor **left/right** buttons until Language is highlighted.
- 3. Press the cursor **up/down** buttons until the language you want is highlighted.
- 4. Press **Enter** to select the language.
- 5. Press the **Menu** button twice to close the OSD.

The image below shows the Language menu. The default language is English.



Appendix A. Troubleshooting

The guidelines below provide tips to deal with problems you may encounter while using the projector. If the problem remains unsolved, contact your dealer for assistance.

Common problems and solutions

Check the following before proceeding to the problem-specific solutions.

- Use a different electrical device in the electrical outlet to confirm that the outlet is working.
- Ensure that the projector is turned on.
- Ensure all connections are securely attached.
- Ensure the attached device is turned on.
- Ensure a connected PC is not in suspend mode.
- Ensure a connected notebook computer is configured for an external display. This is usually done by pressing an Fn-key combination on the notebook.

Tips for troubleshooting

In each problem-specific section, try the steps in the order suggested. This may help you to solve the problem faster.

Try to pinpoint the problem and thus avoid replacing non-defective parts. For example, if you replace batteries and the problem remains, put the original batteries back and go to the next step.

Keep a record of the steps you take when troubleshooting: The information may be useful when calling for technical support or for passing on to service personnel.

Troubleshooting information

The following table provides troubleshooting information for the projector. In some cases, more than one possible solution is provided. Try the solutions in the order they are presented. When the problem is solved, you can skip the additional solutions.

The image is wider at the top or bottom (trapezoid effect).	 Position the projector so it is as perpendicular to the screen as possible. Use the Keystone button on the remote control or projector to correct the problem.
The image is reversed or upside down.	Check the Projection setting on the Setup menu of the OSD.
The image is streaked.	 Set the Frequency and Tracking settings on the Setup menu of the OSD to the default settings. To ensure the problem is not caused by a connected PC's video card, connect to another computer.
The image is flat with no contrast.	Adjust the Contrast setting on the Quality menu of the OSD.
The color of the projected image does not match the source image.	Adjust the Color Temp. and Gamma settings on the Quality menu of the OSD.
There is no light from the projector.	 Check that the power cable is securely connected. Ensure the power source is good by testing with another electrical device. Restart the projector in the correct order and check that the Power LED is green. If you have replaced the lamp recently, try resetting the lamp connections. Make sure the lamp cover is flush with the projector case when closed. Replace the lamp module. "Replacing the projector lamp" on page 5-1. Put the old lamp back in the projector and have the projector serviced.
The lamp goes off.	 Power surges can cause the lamp to turn off. Press the Power button twice to turn off the projector. When the Lamp Ready LED is on, press the Power button. Replace with a new lamp module. "Replacing the projector lamp" on page 5-1. Put the old lamp back in the projector and have the projector serviced.

The term "Machine" means a Lenovo machine, its options, features, conversions, upgrades or peripheral products, or any combination of them. The term "Machine" does not include any software programs, whether pre-loaded with the Machine, installed subsequently or otherwise. Nothing in this Statement of Limited Warranty affects any statutory rights of consumers that cannot be waived or limited by contract.

What this Warranty Covers

Lenovo warrants that each Machine 1) is free from defects in materials and workmanship and 2) conforms to Lenovo's Official Published Specifications ("Specifications") which are available on request. The warranty period for the Machine starts on the original date of installation and is specified in Part 3 - Warranty Information. The date on your invoice or sales receipt is the date of installation unless Lenovo or your reseller informs you otherwise. Unless Lenovo specifies otherwise, these warranties apply only in the country or region in which you purchased the Machine.

THESE WARRANTIES ARE YOUR EXCLUSIVE WARRANTIES AND REPLACE ALL OTHER WARRANTIES OR CONDITIONS, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES OR CONDITIONS OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. SOME STATES OR JURISDICTIONS DO NOT ALLOW THE EXCLUSION OF EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES, SO THE ABOVE EXCLUSION MAY NOT APPLY TO YOU. IN THAT EVENT, SUCH WARRANTIES ARE LIMITED IN DURATION TO THE WARRANTY PERIOD. NO WARRANTIES APPLY AFTER THAT PERIOD. SOME STATES OR JURISDICTIONS DO NOT ALLOW LIMITATIONS ON HOW LONG AN IMPLIED WARRANTY LASTS, SO THE ABOVE LIMITATION MAY NOT APPLY TO YOU.

What this Warranty Does not Cover

This warranty does not cover the following:

- any software programs, whether pre-loaded or shipped with the Machine, or installed subsequently;
- failure resulting from misuse, accident, modification, unsuitable physical or operating environment, or improper maintenance by you;
- failure caused by a product for which Lenovo is not responsible; and
- any non-Lenovo products, including those that Lenovo may procure and provide with or integrate into a Lenovo Machine at your request.

The warranty is voided by removal or alteration of identification labels on the Machine or its parts.

Lenovo does not warrant uninterrupted or error-free operation of a Machine.

Any technical or other support provided for a Machine under warranty, such as assistance with "how-to" questions and those regarding Machine set-up and installation, is provided WITHOUT WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND.

How to Obtain Warranty Service

Warranty service may be provided by Lenovo, IBM, your reseller if authorized to perform warranty service, or an authorized warranty service provider. Each of them is referred to as a "Service Provider."

If the Machine does not function as warranted during the warranty period, contact a Service Provider. If you do not register the Machine with Lenovo, you may be required to present proof of purchase as evidence of your entitlement to warranty service.
